**RAISING THE STANDARD** The RNA Standard Bearers Competition will take place on Saturday 18 May at HMS Excellent on Whale Island in Portsmouth – and entries close at the end of the month. The event is in two parts – the Chester Cup for experienced standard bearers and the Novice Cup for those who are new to the discipline or have less experience. The winner of the Chester Cup will become the RNA National Standard Bearer for the following two years. On Friday 17 May there will be a training session where ceremonial advisors and parade marshalls will be available to offer advice, and there will be an opportunity to run through the competition routine where guidance and notes will be given by the judges. Entries must be made by 29 February to the RNA National Ceremonial Adviser, S/M Mike Smyth, on **nca@rnassoc.org**, giving your name, branch and whether accommodation is requested at HMS Excellent.

**CHAINSAW EXPERIENCE DAY, SOMERSET, SATURDAY 16 MARCH**
