FIRESIDE CHATS Tonight's Fireside Chat will be given by Dr Jann Witt who will be

talking about the German strategy in WWII for defeating the Royal Navy. Jann is a member of the Scientific Advisory Board of the German Society for Shipping and Navy History and served his national service for a short while in the German navy, serving later in the military reserves (attaining the rank of Frigate Captain). Next week's chat (TBC) will be presented by Hannah Prowse, the CEO of

LGBT+ VETERANS INDEPENDENT REVIEW In January 2022, the government published the 'Veterans' Strategy Action Plan: 2022 to 2024', which committed to '...



deliver an independent review into the impact of pre-2000 practices on LGBT+ veterans'. To deliver this, Defence and the Office for Veterans' Affairs co-commissioned the LGBT Veterans Independent Review, chaired by Lord Etherton, in 2022. The review's final report provides the government with a better understanding of the experiences, impacts and implications of the policy and several recommendations for the government to consider. Up to 5000 veterans are estimated to have been affected both mentally and financially. Many were subjected to highly intrusive military police investigations, imprisoned and have lived with criminal records. Some were even put through conversion therapy; chemical


and psychiatric. The findings of the review are hard-hitting and have resulted in the Prime Minister making a formal apology, on behalf of the state, to the Armed Forces LBGT+ community to whom so much wrong was inflicted. The full report can be accessed here.

MALTA CEREMONIAL LIFE RING FINDS ITS WAY HOME In 1979, HMS London, the last British Warship to be based in Malta sailed, signifying the final withdrawal



of British Forces from the Island. The coxswain of London, CPO Mike North, saw the two Gate Guardians, in the form of

AFCS REVIEW – HEADLINE FINDINGS Every five years, the Government commissions a review of the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme (AFCS). The latest review commenced in 2022 and has just published its headline findings and some recommendations. The report can be accessed here. Bear in mind that the independent review details observations and makes recommendation to the Government (MoD) which may or may not be taken forward. The findings at the link are mostly set out above Annex A and information thereafter covers the initial scope of the review.
